For stock trailer, member may load from outside of trailer, secure door before tying (optional) with a quick release tie.			
11	Demonstrate unloading a horse from a horse trailer/Speak to horse quietly, untie head first, unlatch butt/bar/gate/chain encourage horse to back out slowly. If unloading from stock trailer,member will be on the outside of trailer, horse may be allowed to come out front-ways, lead rope should be placed over neck of horse for safety

12	Discuss the uses of leg wraps/protection, injury, cleanliness	
13	Demonstrate the proper way to wrap a horses front legs/begin with rolled wrap below knee, wrap in downward direction and return back up, secureDo NOT pull across the tendon	
14	Demonstrate the proper way to wrap a horses hind legs/begin with rolled wrap below knee, wrap in downward direction and return back up, secureDo NOT pull across the tendon	
	GROOMING FOR SHOW	
15	Describe the preparation of a horse for fitting and showing or showmanship <b>weeks prior</b> to show/Clip; ears, legs,muzzle,throat latch, mane and tail	
16	Describe the preparation of a horse for fitting and showing or showmanship the <b>day of</b> a show/wash socks, band mane(day of or day before), hair polish or show sheen, brush tail (mane), clean nose and muzzle and apply mineral oil, paint hooves

23	Describe why you might choose to vaccinate every 6 months instead of annually. Horse is exposed to other horses, mosquitos, etc either caused by your horse leaving your facility or other horses beging brought into your facility Young, old, Horses with compromised immunitity.	
24	Discuss which vaccines their horse received last and when: Discuss why the specific vaccines were chosen. Horses exposed to many facilities, veterinarian recomendation, etc.	
25	What is a coggins test? Verifying that the horse does not have antibodies to EIAV What if your horse tests positive? There is not a cure. The horse is quaranteed for life or euthanized	
25	Discuss which dewormer their horse received last and when was it administered.	
26	Discuss how to give one to horse/insert the tube a few inches into the corner of mouth, angle upward between the horse's cheek and premolar, dispense paste, grasp horse's chin and allow paste to dissolve in mouth	
27	Discuss the use of de-wormers. Describe the standard worming schedule for their horse. Include considerations for Fecal count? Time? Pasture? Fecal count is the correct way to determine if your horse needs to be wormed. Grass pastures allow for spread of worms. Dry lots generically have few worms.	
28	Under normal conditions, when would consider worming again.	

29	Describe the basic nutritional requirements for your horse at their activity level. Should be 1.5 - 2.5% of body weight daily, supplements as needed and plenty of fresh water	
30	How much is 1.5 - 2.5%? 1000lb = 15 to 25 lb per day, 7.5lb to 12.5lb per feeding 100lb bale = 12/14 flakes = ~7-8 lbs per flake What type of hay and how much is your horse fed am: What type of hay and how much is your horse fed pm:	
31	Describe what supplements you give your horse. (Salt at a minimum )	

	BAREBACK RIDING	 
	Test must be ridden one handed for western, two handed for English, and as correct for seat/discipline, done at the rail. Proper English or Western Tack as per PCHP Rule Book is required. NOTE FOR WESTERN: A horse 5 years and under may be ridden two handed with a snaffle or bosal.	
	Demonstrate correct body position, calmness, lightness, rhythm and coordination and proper use of legs	 
32	Mounts properly, may use mounting block	
33	Move out at a walk/proper body position	
34	Reverse direction at a walk/turn toward inside of arena	
35	Slowly transition to a trot/jog, reverse direction at the trot/jog	
36	Transition into a lope/canter, with the correct lead
